The Spiritual Significance Of Music

Music is the sound of the soul freeing itself. Music, particularly live music, is the most ephemeral of artistic media: the moment the vibration leaves the instrument, it travels endlessly outward in all directions at the speed of love. So to play music, especially improvisational music straight from the heart, is essentially an act of setting positive energy free in the world, and what could be more spiritual than that? As a percussionist, I have a special regard for the drum not only as a musical instrument but also as a shamanic implement. In whatever musical genre I happen to be playing, I am mindful that rhythm is the heartbeat of life itself, and that at the highest level of musicianship I am merely the instrument through which that universal language is being expressed. This degree of musicality also requires one to be a careful, attentive, generous, compassionate, and extremely flexible listener, much more so than a great player. For me, music originates in silence; so the stillness and space between the notes must be appreciated and performed every bit as much as the notes themselves in order for music to attain its truly spiritual dimension.
